The University of Melbourne was founded in 1853 and combines historic British architecture with modern well-equipped libraries, computer labs and sports facilities.

The University of Melbourne is located merely a few minutes walk from downtown Melbourne. Its campus is landscaped with trees and gardens, and is bordered by parklands. The suburb of Carlton, with a large collection of Italian restaurants, coffeehouses, pizzerias and gelaterias, makes UniMelb an ideal place to study. Over the years, the University of Melbourne has achieved a strong international academic reputation. The 2006 Good Universities Guide ranks UniMelb graduates as having one of the best rates of employment upon graduation.
