Housing

Students are guaranteed accommodation in off-campus apartments leased through the UNSW Study Abroad office. Apartments are located in Coogee, Bondi, and Randwick (an eastern suburb of Sydney close to Centennial Park, Fox Studios, Bondi Beach, Oxford Street, and “downtown” Sydney). The apartments are ideal for beach-side living. Students have the option of requesting housemates, although not all preferences can be accommodated.
